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About CUHK Jockey Club Ophthalmic Microsurgical Training Programme (CUHK JC OMTP)

The Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences of the Faculty of Medicine at The Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK) has received a generous donation from The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust for the establishment of the CUHK Jockey Club Ophthalmic Microsurgical Training Programme. With the commencement of this programme in January 2018, eye doctors and eye care professionals will be able to learn, practise and enhance their surgical and procedural skills in simulation environment without any risks to patients.

The CUHK JC OMTP provides high-fidelity simulated eye surgery training with artificial eyes, animal eyes and adnexa, as well as computer-generated 3-dimensional virtual reality operative environments. There are 6 versatile work stations equipped with operating microscopes with floor stands and foot control pedals for the best visualization enabling microsurgical operations with the highest precision. The ergonomics of our work stations mimic the operating theatre as closely as possible.

One of the key elements of success of CUHK JC OMTP is the availability of dedicated and highly professional instructors from Hong Kong's public hospitals, both universities and private sector, who are qualified by the College of Ophthalmologists of Hong Kong. In additional to Hong Kong's asset of highly qualified and skilled ophthalmic surgeon trainers, a number of well-renowned international advisors have made major contributions to each of the subspecialties of our training programme.





The beauty of simulated surgical training is that you can learn all the skills and techniques in a completely safe and also stress-free environment. We encourage candidates to practice the procedures many times until they are perfectly comfortable and confident before they start operating on real patients.



Prof Clement THAM

The most important of all is the virtual reality training. This is quite new in ophthalmology and the surgeons would learn muscle memory, which to me is very important.



The concept of simulated surgeries has been widespread throughout ophthalmology. If someone can practise their surgery in the animal model or in a simulated model first before going to operate on human subject, definitely the safety of the surgery, the efficiency as well as the speed of learning would be much enhanced.

Nowadays, patients' expectations on surgeons' skills are very high, especially in parents. It is difficult to tell them that the surgeons have not undergone any simulation training before they operate on a real patient. 


